

HOW TO UPDATE YOUR SIGNATURE & OTHER DETAILS

Deadline to Update Voting Details: October 5, 2020

In the 2018 primary election, 32,176 mail ballots went uncounted. A main cause for rejected ballots is the opinion of under-trained individuals who decide the signature on file with the Supervisor of Elections (SOE) office does not match the signature on the vote-by-mail ballot. Most times, the signature you used at the DMV when you got your license is the signature on file with the SOE office.

If you're unsure what signature is on file at the Supervisor of Elections office, don't risk having it questioned when you send in your vote-by-mail ballot. Update it with a new voter registration form.

Online Option:

If you'd like to update your signature to the one found on your valid driver's license you can update your voter details at www.registertovoteflorida.gov and upon completion the signature on file with the DMV will be sent to the SOE office.

Printed Option:

1. Visit www.registertovoteflorida.gov and click the links to download and print a new voter registration form in English or Español directly below the Register/Update button.
2. Check "Record Update/Change"

Numbered rows 1 through 7 and 12 must be completed for a new registration.
